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# 7 Tips for Better Bottom Navigation

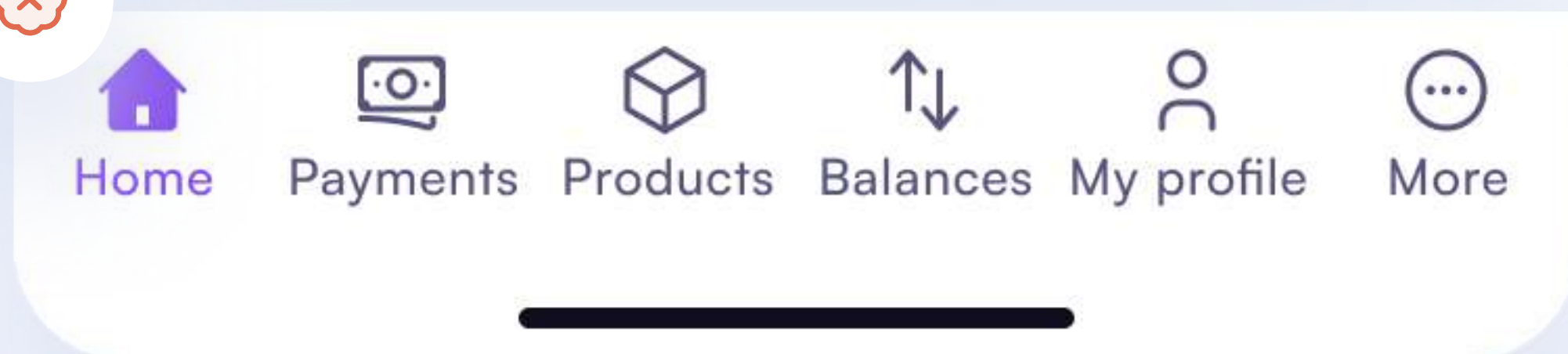
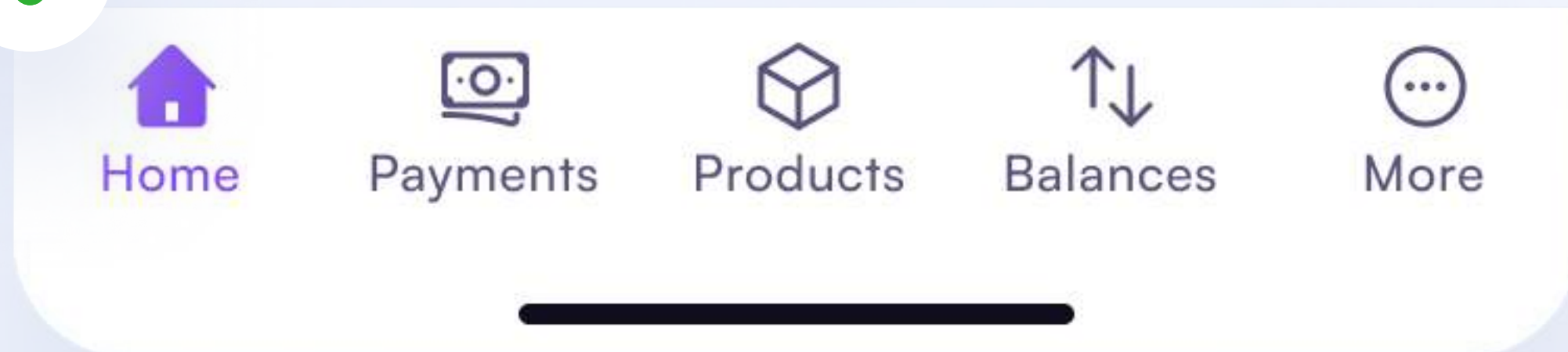

# Maximum 5 items

Don't include more than five items within the bottom navigation to keep the destinations accessible and fit all the devices.



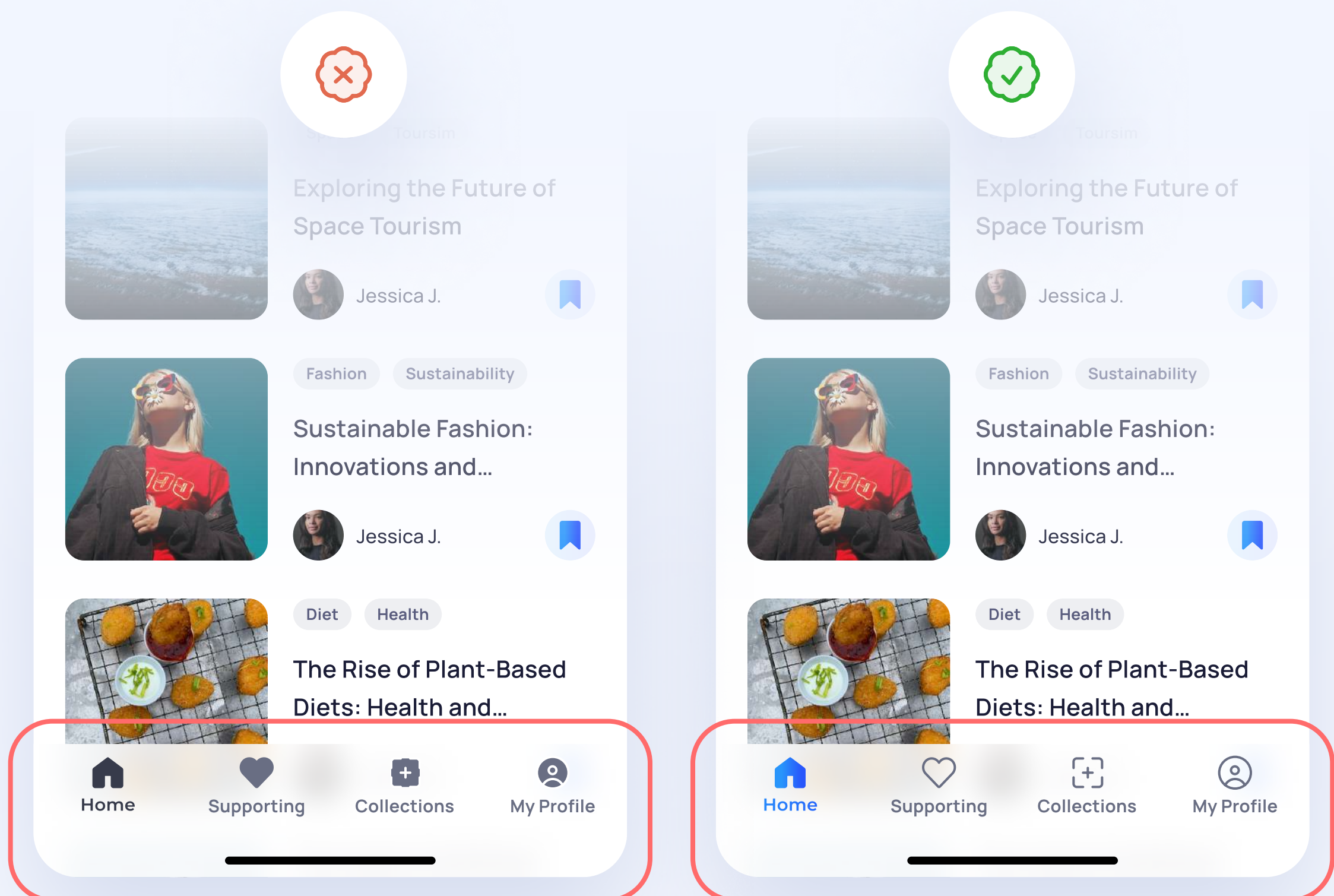

## Clear active state

Ensure that users can **identify where they're located** within the navigation system fast. You can do it with a clear and bold active state.

## Including labels

Of course, there are situations where the icons are really self-explanatory and you don't have to add text below, but **most of the time you have to provide more context.**

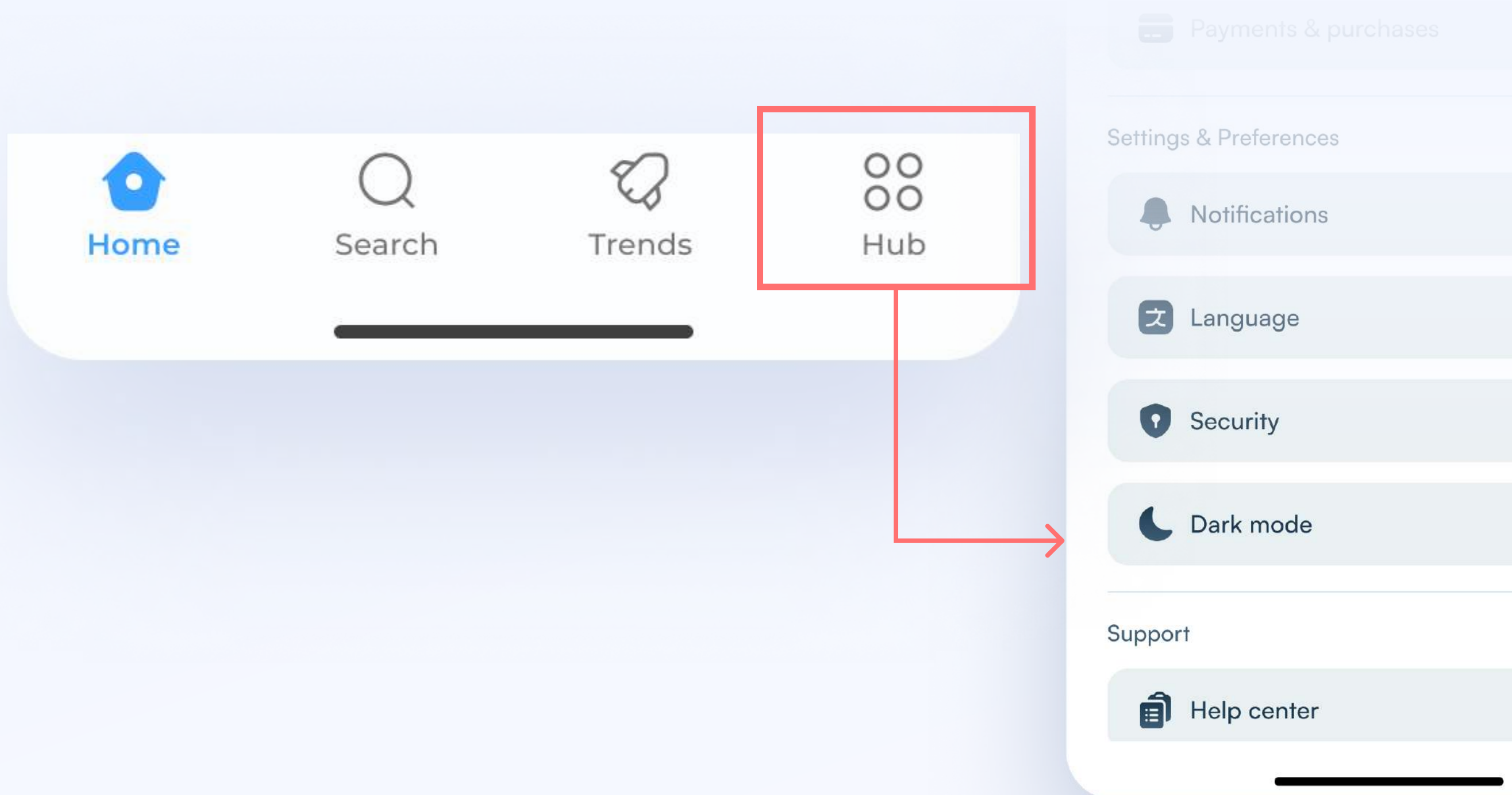

## “More” or “Hub” item

Usually, the navigations are more complex and it's hard to fit all the destinations into 5 items. By including the “More” or “Hub” menu at the really last position of the nav you make it scalable.





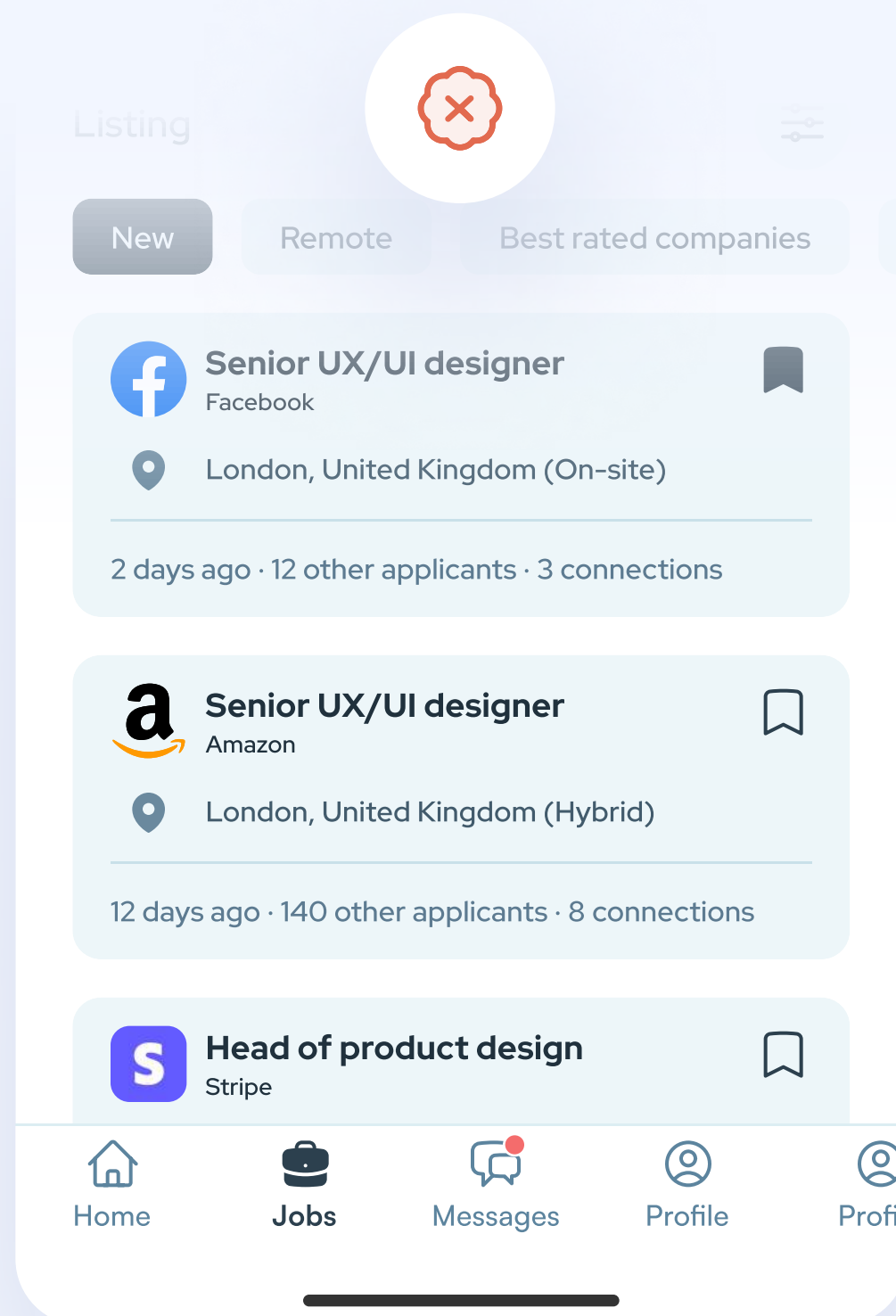

# No scrolling

Absolutely no-go is **horizontal scrolling** of multiple items within the navigation. The different situation is for tabs, but that's a component with a different purpose.



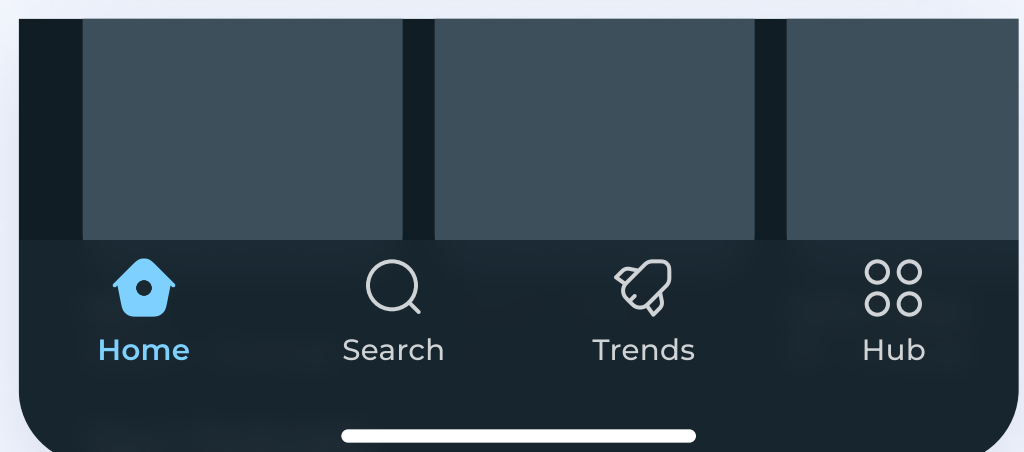
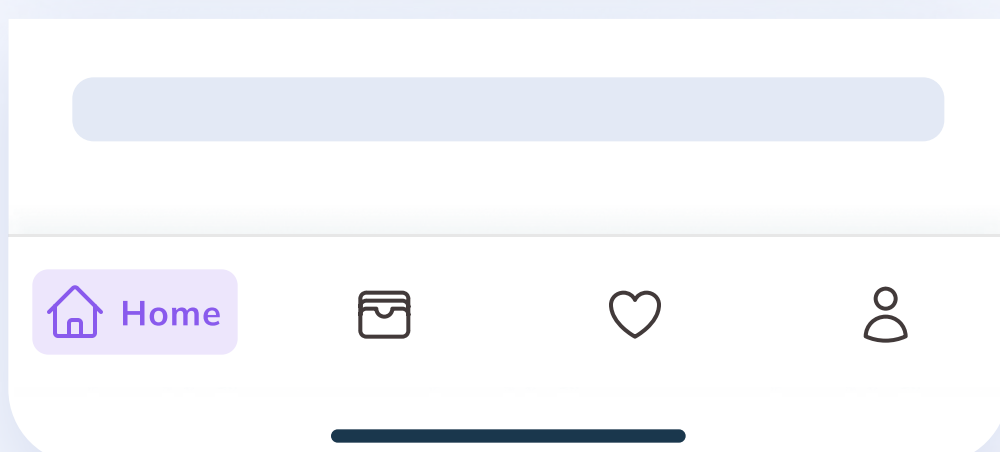
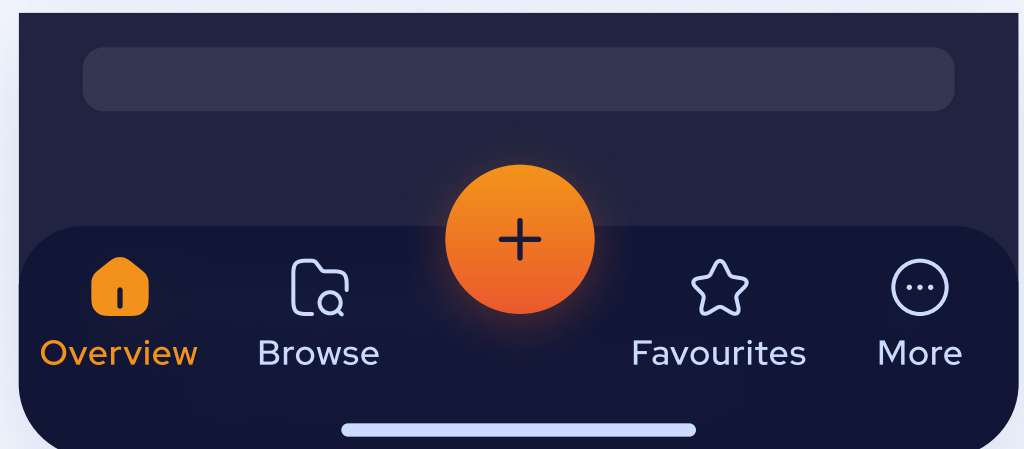
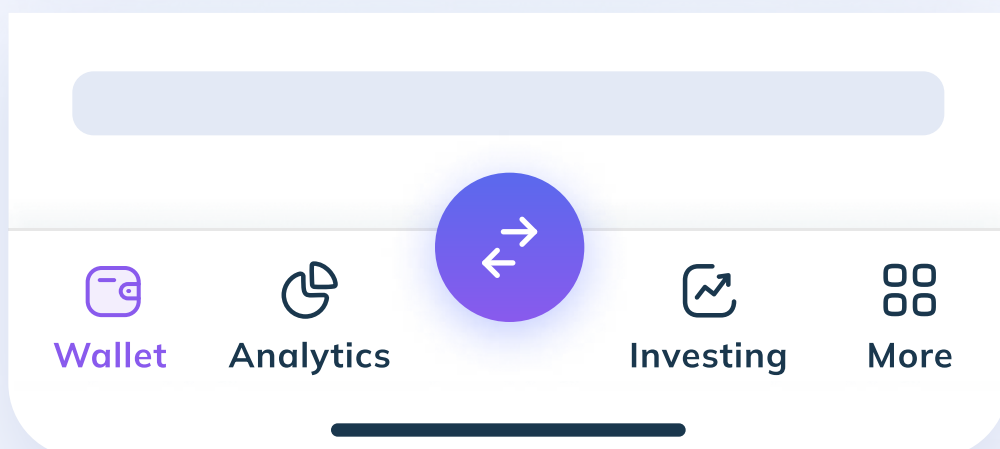
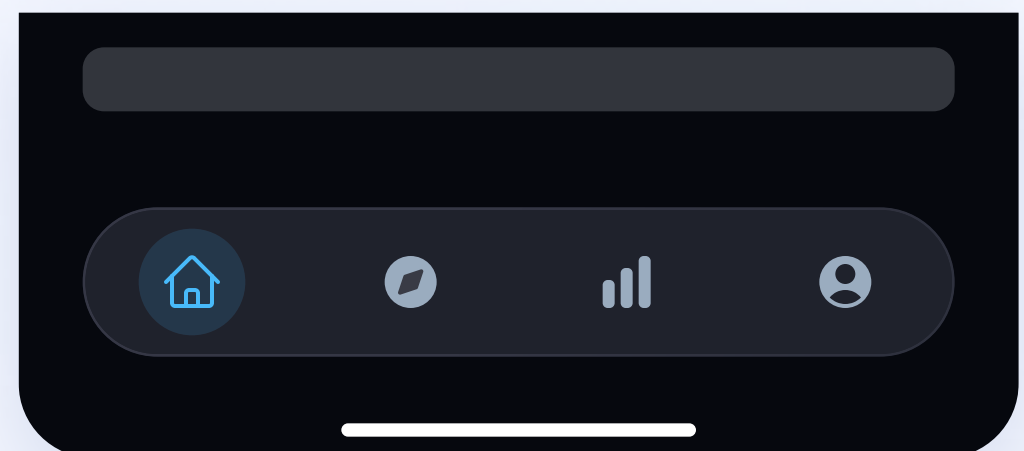
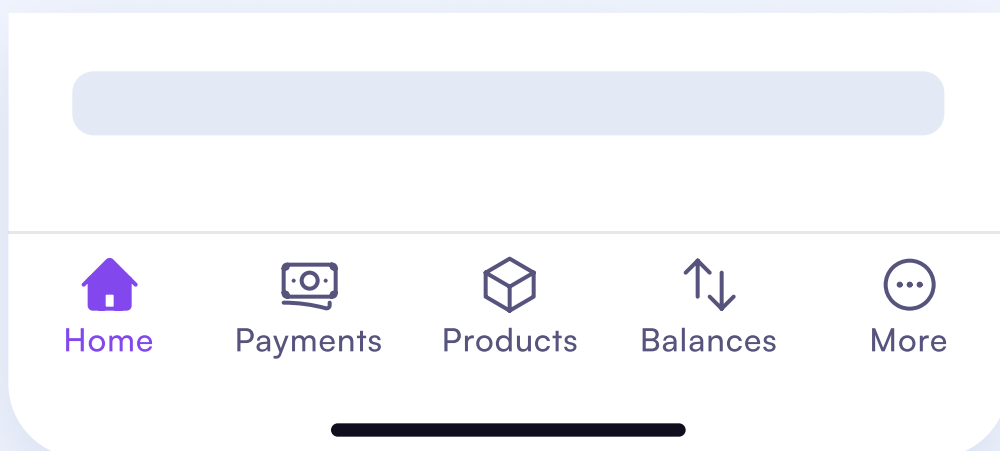
